# Framework for Success at CTD

How do we think about success for a CTD student? The definition is multifaceted and manifests differently at each stage of a student's development. In general, success includes

- meeting course learning objectives (academic achievement) and engaging in learning
- seeing opportunity in challenges, setting goals, demonstrating perseverance, and exhibiting motivation (academic persistence)
- acquiring study skills, adapting to changes and self-regulating learning (learning strategies)
- engaging appropriately in peer and social interactions, respecting diversity, demonstrating empathy, cooperation, active listening and responsibility (interpersonal and social skills)
